#### Message from the Consul General

A chairde,

Team Ireland is again intensifying its engagement with the great State of Florida, a land of Irish interests and huge potential. Irish firms employ well over 5000 people in Florida and within Florida's 20 million population there are 1.8 million people with Irish heritage and 800,000 Irish citizens.

In Tallahassee, I was warmly welcomed by Governor Scott, House Speaker Corcoran, Minority Leader Cruz and the Florida Chamber during Opening Day at the Florida Legislature for discussions on reciprocal investment, heritage ties and politics.

Back in Washington in January, Ambassador Mulhall hosted Congressman Tom Rooney and his wife at his Residence.

Perhaps even more powerfully, the Riverdance tour has delighted huge audiences along the length of Florida, welcoming in friends such as Tampa's Mayor Bob Buckhorn, and Ireland's Honorary Consuls for Florida, Terry Delahunty and Ian O'Flaherty.

<u>IDA Ireland</u> are now at the Florida Venture Forum in Ft Lauderdale, explaining Ireland's strengths as a base for European expansion.

This pattern will continue. Ambassador Mulhall will join the Ireland Funds, the U.S. Ireland Council, the South Florida Irish American Chamber of Commerce for community and business events in Palm Beach.

#### **Irish News**

Speaking to the European Parliament in the first of a series of debates on the Future of Europe, <u>the Taoiseach</u> <u>stressed the importance of our common values</u> and of remaining united to address the challenges of the 21st century.

He also delivered the <u>keynote speech on National Holocaust Memorial Day</u> to the Holocaust Education Trust Ireland, concluding "...we can never recover what was lost. All we can do is share a warning from history and send a message of hope that will resonate for all time." See photograph above.

The Tánaiste, Simon Coveney, undertook a <u>4-day visit to Cairo, Jerusalem, Tel Aviv, Ramallah and Gaza</u> where he met with leaders on a range of bilateral and regional issues including the Peace Process.

Minister Coveney announced the "Promote Ireland" programme of international events over the St. Patrick's Day period which will see Government representatives taking part in programmes to promote Ireland and Irish interests in almost 40 countries across the globe.

Minister of State for European Affairs, Helen McEntee TD kicked off our Future of Europe Citizens' Dialogue.

Minister of State for Financial Services and Insurance Michael D'Arcy TD launched the Government's 2018 <a href="IFS2020 Action Plan">IFS2020 Action Plan</a> as part of its 5-year strategy to be the recognised global location of choice for specialist international financial services. He joined the Taoiseach today hosting the annual European Financial Forum in Dublin Castle.

2018 will be a year of intense activity in support of the Irish language. <u>Bliain na Gaeilge 2018</u>, a year-long programme of events, and a social media initiative on Twitter, <u>#TrasnaNadTonnta</u>, kicked off in style. Dublin City University has also developed a <u>free online Irish Language course</u> ("Irish 101") for the global diaspora and new immigrants.

New data indicate <u>continuing strong employment growth</u> and that 4 out of 5 new jobs created since the Government was formed were outside Dublin. <u>IDA announced</u> that at year-end 2017 the agency had surpassed its five-year job creation target two years ahead of schedule.

Atlanta-headquartered <u>tech firm N3</u> announced it will create 100 new jobs, doubling its Irish workforce.

CSO statistics confirmed that <u>2017 was a record year for overseas visitors</u> to Ireland, up 3.6% over 2016 despite of a 5% decline from Great Britain. Visits from North America were up 16.2%.

We congratulate Irish Golden Globe Award Winners Saoirse Ronan and London Irish winner Martin McDonagh, and wish good luck to them and the other <u>Irish Academy Award Nominees</u> Daniel Day Lewis, Nora Twomey & Consolata Boyle.

Tributes were paid to singer Dolores O'Riordan and former Attorney General and EU Commissioner Peter Sutherland following their deaths in January.

<u>Consul General Stephens' book review</u> of *The Supreme Court* by Ruadhán Mac Cormaic appears in Global Atlanta titled: "Books 2017: How the Irish and American Supreme Courts Grew Up Together."

The College of Charleston (CofC) has launched an <u>oral history project</u> that will gather stories of local Irish and Irish Americans and archive them in the Irish Heritage Project at CofC's Addlestone Library.
