### **Irish News**

An Taoiseach Leo Varadkar undertook a four-city St Patrick's trip to Austin, Oklahoma, Washington, D.C. and New York. In Washington he <a href="mailto:met with President Trump">met with President Trump</a> in the Oval office, attended the annual <a href="mailto:lirish lunch on Capitol Hill">lirish lunch on Capitol Hill</a> hosted by Speaker Paul Ryan, delivered remarks at the traditional <a href="mailto:shamrock ceremony at the White House">shamrock ceremony at the White House</a>, was hosted for <a href="mailto:breakfast by Vice President Pence">breakfast by Vice President Pence</a>, and gave <a href="mailto:a foreign policy speech">a foreign policy speech</a> to The Brookings Institution. See the <a href="mailto:great-video">great-video</a> of the Shamrock ceremony.

The Taoiseach's trip began with a visit to Choctaw Nation to commemorate the help it provided to the Irish people during the Great Famine and to announce a new scholarship programme. In New York, he announced an additional Government Grant of \$2.52 million to help build the new Irish Arts Center there and participated in New York's St. Patrick's Day Parade.

Tánaiste and Minister for Foreign Affairs and Trade, Simon Coveney TD, expressed solidarity with the British government following the Salisbury attack and <u>outlined the Government's response</u> to the Dáil.

Ireland has had continuous presence on UN peace support operations since 1958. This Easter over 600 Irish women and men served in 19 crisis management and peace support missions worldwide.

The Minister of State for Equality, Immigration and Integration, David Stanton, opened his Department's "Promoting the Political Engagement of Migrants 2018" initiative meant to increase migrant political participation.

Chaired by Ireland's Permanent Representative, Geraldine Byrne Nason, the 62<sup>nd</sup> Session of the UN Commission on the Status of Women concluded with unprecedented agreement on the <u>rights of rural women & girls</u>.

The Minister of State for the Diaspora and International Development, Ciarán Cannon T.D., published a new Report on <u>Addressing Challenges Faced by Returning Irish Emigrants</u>. The Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade launched a <u>new website portal</u> with a range of resources to support returning emigrants.

Hainan Airlines plans to launch a <u>Beijing-Dublin service</u> commencing on the 12th of June 2018, the first direct service from Ireland to mainland China.

Congratulations to the Irish rugby team on their St. Patrick's Day Grand Slam victory!

<u>Pearse Lyons</u>, one Ireland's most influential businessman in America, died at his home in Kentucky. Dr. Lyons grew his biotech livestock and poultry business from an initial \$10,000 investment in 1980 to over \$2.5 billion today.

We are deeply proud of the fact that the Florida House of Representatives adopted a <u>Resolution</u> honoring the relationship between the State of Florida & Ireland. Sincere thanks Representative Clay Ingram for this important initiative.
