Dear Mr O'Driscoll,

I refer to the request which you have made under the Freedom of Information Act 2014 for access to records held by this Department, as follows:

"I would be obliged if you would let me know for <u>each</u> of the seven years, 2009 to 2015 (both inclusive):

Grants, etc, payable to each of the following, and to any organisations under their control:

- 1. World Health Organisation (WHO),
- UNFPA,
- 3. (International) Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF), (if any paid),
- 4. European Network Member Association,
- 5. Irish Family Planning Association (IFPA),
- 6. Irish Council for Civil Liberties (ICCL),
- 7. Amnesty.

Distinction should be made between:

Ex gratia grants, and

Other grants and payments for services rendered.

Amounts estimated to be E10,000, or less for an organisation, can be disregarded. (Your response may be appropriately qualified).

This request is made under the FOI Act."

I have identified records in relation to four organisations that fall within the scope of your request and made a decision to grant your request. Details of the funding support to these organisations are set out in the table below.
