

#### **St Patrick's Festival**

From 12th – 17th March, St. Patrick's Festival under the theme of "Dúisigh Éire! Awaken Ireland!" features more than 100 events, created by artists, performers, makers and dreamers across Ireland. With programming strands for music, young people, illuminations, conversations, and virtual parade workshops, there is something for all tastes, showcased through St. Patrick's Festival TV - SPF TV - at [www.stpatricksfestival.ie](http://www.stpatricksfestival.ie).

For six great virtual days and nights, you can stream the full programme of events in real time, or replay favourite shows on the Festival website player. **Wales** features this (Tuesday) evening with [Seoda: Celtic Connections, hosted by Huw Stephens](#) with stellar performances from leading artists from Wales, Ireland and Scotland.

#### **The Late Late Show St. Patrick's Day Special**

Join Ryan Tubridy at **9.35pm**, for the first Late Late Show ever broadcast on a Wednesday. It is hoped the event will become a "global hub", attracting hundreds of thousands from around the world to celebrate "the joy, beauty and passion of being Irish". ### **Enterprise Ireland, UK**

### **St Patrick's Day at Home with Tourism Ireland**

This unique 90-minute broadcast will beam out from three much-loved pubs in Dublin, Belfast and Dingle in County Kerry. There will be a huge welcome, traditional and modern Irish music and dance, fantastic fun and lots of surprises. Immediately after the St Patrick's Festival, over 100 artists will feature in Culture Ireland's SEODA, an online festival and global celebration of Irish culture that runs March 17-21, 2021. SEODA (Irish for 'jewels') celebrates Irish arts worldwide at a time when Irish artists would normally be supported by Culture Ireland to travel the globe. She was also instrumental in the creation of the Newtown Memorial Garden on Tyndall Street, where many of her friends gathered to pay their last respects and to commemorate her achievements.
